

Picasso Project 2011 Student Permission/Media Slip



- Teachers, Parents, guardians and after school art programs can register and submit student artwork.
- Registration must be completed and artwork dropped off at specified regional locations.
- All information can be accessed via our website scchildren.org (click *News and Events* then *Picasso Project*.)

Please read the following information thoroughly.

Your student is invited to participate in the annual Picasso Project Student Art Competition. The Picasso Project is an annual, statewide, juried student art competition with all the winning pieces donated to the Children's Trust. The project is about kids helping kids and engaging youth in philanthropy through their artistic talents.

Eligibility and judging process

This competition is open to all students, grades 6 -12. Teachers, community leaders and parents can make art submissions. Participating student artwork will be juried in each of nine regions with a total of 12 winners, 3 for art and 3 for photography, for middle and high school. Artwork of regional winners will advance to the state competition and all state and regional winning artwork will be auctioned at the Picasso Project Gala in August 2012. Artwork entries must be either a school assignment or an independent work of art.

Kids helping kids

All funds raised at the gala and through the sale of student artwork support the mission and programs of the Children's Trust of South Carolina. In the past six years, student artwork has raised more than \$20,000 to support specific programs that prevent child abuse, neglect and unintentional injuries, such as our Cribs for Kids® South Carolina, a safe sleep initiative designed to reduce infant deaths.

Awards luncheon

Regional and statewide winners will be celebrated at the Picasso Project Student's Award Luncheon in Columbia, SC on April 21, 2012. Details of the event will be forwarded to parents and teachers after the statewide judging event.

Very important

- It is **imperative** that we have your **correct email address**. This is how we will notify art teachers and parents/guardians of juried results and how we will be forwarding details of the awards luncheon.
- **The permission slip (next page) must be completed and attached to the back of the student.** If a piece of art is submitted without a permission slip, it will be disqualified. The permission slip tells the Children's Trust that the student/ parent/ guardian/ teacher is aware that the artwork is being donated and the regional winner's artwork will not be returned. (Please read *Exception*).
- **Parents/Guardians:** if you are submitting artwork on behalf of your child without going through a school you must complete the online registration form. You can access it by going to our website scchildren.org (**click *News and Events* tab at top then *Picasso Project* in the left menu**).
- **Exception:** Student artwork not selected as a regional winner will stay at the drop-off location for parent(s)/ guardian(s) or teacher(s) to pick-up. CTSC will notify all parent(s)/ guardian(s) and teacher(s) of the winners via email. If your student's name isn't listed, please make arrangements to reclaim your artwork with your regional drop-off location. *All artwork MUST be picked up within two weeks of notification. After two weeks the location will no longer be responsible for remaining artwork.*

Disclaimer: The Children's Trust of South Carolina is not responsible for artwork that is not reclaimed at the regional drop-off location.
